Corporate Counselling and Chaplaincy Inc. is a non-denominational organization designed to provide "quick response" assistance to those in need and to support individuals seeking meaningful solutions in their lives. They help by addressing physical, emotional and spiritual needs. Their purpose is to share God's love and care as evidenced by the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

I will be released on parole shortly and would like to meet people who are committed to the Word of God and are interested in riding motorcycles.





Praying for the Word

any people treat prayer like frequent fliers treat the pre-flight safety announcements when traveling by air. It's a yawning experience, hardly worth the time. I have never yet seen the oxygen mask dangling in front of my face! Sometimes we treat prayer in the same way. It's a lot easier to talk and even to preach about prayer than to actually pray.

One of the reasons we do not experience more power in our lives is the lack of quality and quantity in our prayers.!t's the earnest, heartfelt, continued prayer of a righteous man that makes tremendous power available and dynamic in its working (James 5:16).

So don't get tired of doing what is good. Don't be discouraged and give up, for we will reap a harvest of blessing at the appropriate time (Galatians 6:9).

Unfortunately, our prayers are often 911 prayers like that of Phil's son Jeffrey. Jeffrey was only four, but Phil removed him from the worship service. He was creating quite a stir, judging from the way everyone was looking at him. So Father picked him up and whisked him swiftly toward the back doors of the church. As he did, Jeffrey hollered, "Pray for me!"

How different were the prayers of students in Argentina! Dr. Edward Miller tells the story of how fifty students began to pray and experienced the power of God through prayer. The school had to suspend classes because of the heavy prayer burden they had for Argentina. Day after day, forty-nine days in a row, these students prayed and interceded for their land.

Dr. Miller says that he had never seen people weep so long and so hard. One man leaned his head against a brick wall and wept until, after four hours, a trail of tears had run down the wall. After

six hours had passed, he was standing in a puddle of his own tears.

These students weren't just repenting for something they had done; they were repenting on behalf of their country. On the fiftieth day of weeping, a prophetic Word came forth, "Weep no more, for the Lion of the Tribe of Judah has prevailed over the prince of Argentina." Eighteen months later, Argentines were flocking to evangelistic services in soccer stadiums that seated 180,000 people.

If God can get enough people to pray and intercede with brokenness and repentance, He will slap an eviction notice on the doorway of the ruling demonic power of that area. When He does, light and glory will come.

Take a Passion test; be honest with yourself and God. How often and how fervently do I pray for the lost? How often does compassion rise in me to pray for the salvation of hard-core rebels? Do I ever find myself crying for the lost in my time of prayer? Do I share the gospel with those around me?

Did you rate low in your compassion for the lost? Only God can restore that. But first you have to see it, repent of it, want it, and then ask for God's kind of compassion for the lost. No one can come to the Father except the Father draws them... Pray that the Father will draw many.

As many Scriptures are distributed all over Canada, let's bathe them in prayer, praying that the Holy Spirit will use the Word of God to bring people to Himself.

Youth Unlimited is a branch of Youth for Christ in Toronto. Every week three groups of teen moms meet for our outreach program, "Time Out for Teen Moms." While the moms have their time of teaching and fun, the little ones enjoy a children's program.

These teen moms are spiritually hungry. Life is full of over-

whelming challenges for them, and they struggle with the knowledge that they have made poor choices in the past. As they hear about the love of God for them and experience the care and guidance of our workers, many of them are drawn to the Saviour. As their spiritual interest awakens, we give them Bibles and teach them how to use the Bibles so they can read them on their own. These gifts are deeply appreciated.

What a thrill it was for our Teen Moms Director, Margie, to receive a call from Manda. Manda is a young mom whom Margie first met when she was holding her tiny baby, looking into the casket of her boyfriend, who had been shot in a drug-related conflict. After being in the Teen Moms group for a few months, Manda began to consider her need for God. When she called Margie, she said she had been reading her Bible and had finally come to the conclusion that she wanted to give her life to Christ.

A response from a client at a Crisis Pregnancy Centre after receiving a Bible:


I like this material because it has taught me how much God loves me, unconditionally, and died on the cross to forgive us of our sins. He is my best friend and also my Father and many other great things.

The Bible as a Refuge

Thank you for sending us the *Life Recovery Bibles*. We really like these Bibles because they correlate with the 12-Step Program we run with many of the addicts, and it gives them a scriptural foundation for the twelve steps. We give Bibles to inmates when they leave jail so that they can work through the twelve steps themselves from a strong biblical point of view.

We gave one Bible prematurely to Candy, who was still serving her time. She told us that she loves the language of this Bible, which makes the gospel very clear to her. One time when she had a disagreement with one of the guards and couldn't sleep, she read the Bible for hours and found rest and peace for her mind.



Another time her room was tossed, and some of her craft supplies were ruined. Because of her growth and the Bible as a ready resource, she was able to forgive the guard, rather than being hampered by unforgiveness, bitterness and anger – possibly not a big deal for you and me, but a really big deal in a

place where one's life is completely controlled by others. The Bible has become a refuge for her, as well as for many others who are on the "outside," trying to figure out, with God, how it all fits.

Healing for the Wounded

Healing Hearts is a church plant in Regina, Sask., started in 1994 "to bring the healing touch of Jesus to wounded hearts." The leadership team provides teaching, counseling, support group opportunities, youth ministry, hospital and prison visitation and extensive one-on-one discipleship.

Betty (not her real name) walked into the community centre apprehensively. With four little girls in tow, she scanned the large room for a place to seat her active family. Her neighbour girl had told her about this church and invited her to come. "There's a barbecue after...," she was told.

Betty came back to Healing Hearts a couple more times but found her little ones too hard to handle in church. They were too shy to participate in Sunday school, so the harried mom would tug them back home partway though the service. Yet, she enjoyed the casual atmosphere, the coffee, and the welcome she experienced at this church in north-central Regina. Both aboriginal and non-

aboriginal people worshiped together, and she felt accepted.

Once again Betty brought her family through the community centre doors – desperate and needy. The pain of her abusive past, living in foster homes and turning to a life on the street had finally brought her to this point of decision. This time her children went willingly to Sunday school, and she was able to concentrate on what the preacher was saying. Her tears would not stop as the speaker gave an invitation to lay all her hurt and anger on Jesus. A couple of women gathered around her, listened to her and prayed for her.

A few months later, Betty stood in front of the Healing Hearts church family, nervously sharing her conversion testimony before her baptism. In her shaking hand, she held a copy of *My City, My God* – a gift from the church for this special occasion. Her daughters smiled and clapped, along with everyone else, as they witnessed their mother rising victoriously from the baptismal waters.

I am privileged to visit women, mostly native, in the Remand Centre. Native women are remanded at a higher ratio and may not have means to get bail.

They are the most hopeless, abused and hurt sector of society. From the day they are born, they have no rights over their bodies or anything else. They are frightened, fragile and mistrusting. They do not expect to be loved and feel jail is their destiny, and despair is their constant companion. They would love to believe that Jesus really cares about them.

I take *Indian Life* newspapers and Gideon New Testaments when I visit. I have received a generous donation of the booklet *Prisoners* of *Hope* so I can give every woman a copy. They are well received, and many of the women tell me these booklets have been a help to them.

Once they are sentenced, they move on to other jails, and I don't get


